Deputies make \$42,202.00 a year and are behind

Wayne County: 8 % Wabash County: 10 %

Madison and Howard Counties: 17 %

Boone County: 33 % Wells County: 35 %

Overall Deputies at Grant County make 30 percent less than their counterparts across the

state

Jail Officers make \$32,575.00 a year and are behind

Wayne County: 8 %

Wabash County and Madison County: 13 %

Howard County: 36 % Boone County: 33 % Wells County: 34 %

Dispatchers make \$32,575.00 a year and are behind

Wells County: 10 % Wayne County: 17 % Howard County: 19 % Boone County: 51 %

Other Counties mentioned above are unavailable

Clerks make \$29, 121.00 a year and are behind

Wayne County: 9 % Wells County: 15% Howard County: 18 % Wabash County: 28 % Boone County: 61 %
